

Through the official Girl Scout curriculum, GSUSA and local Girl Scout councils present concerning content such as: honor pro-abortion politicians and abortion rights activists, highlight organizations that advocate for abortion rights and/or organizations that fund abortion providers, as well as additional curriculum concerns. GSUSA and local Girl Scout councils honor/promote pro-abortion politicians and abortion rights activists

Every Girl Scout council, through the official Girl Scout curriculum for girls, recommends and features reproductive/abortion rights advocates. Page scans provided in the following examples are provided from Girl Scout curriculum books purchased from the Girl Scout organization:

- Gloria Steinem – iconic advocate for abortion rights and reproductive freedom. Proudly participated in the “we had abortions” campaign to remove the stigma of abortion. Staunch supporter of Planned Parenthood. (documentation at this [link](#))
- Hillary Clinton – pro-abortion Secretary of State, US Senator and 2016 Democratic Presidential Candidate. (documentation at this [link](#))
- Betty Friedan – founder of the National Abortion Rights Action League (NARAL). Founder of NOW that claims abortion rights as top priority. (documentation at this [link](#))
- Shirley Chisolm – US Representative and outspoken abortion rights advocate. First honorary President of NARAL. (documentation at this [link](#))
- Geraldine Ferraro – pro-choice Catholic Vice Presidential candidate. (documentation at this [link](#))
- Dolores Huerta – prominent Catholic supporter of abortion rights. Accepted Planned Parenthood's highest honor, the Margaret Sanger award. Helped defeat California parental notification requirements for minors’ abortions. (documentation at this [link](#))
- Simone de Beauvoir – Philosopher and author hailed as a founder of feminism. Known to have underage female lovers, including students, while teaching. Staunch defender of abortion rights. Signed a public list of famous women who had abortions. (documentation at this [link](#))
- Elizabeth Gurley Flynn – founder of ACLU. Chairwoman of the American Communist Party. Early proponent of birth control. (documentation at this [link](#))
- Billy Jean King – abortion rights advocate. Works to remove the stigma of abortion by publicizing her own illegal abortion. (documentation at this [link](#))
- Martina Navratilova – abortion rights advocate who proudly publicizes her financial support of Planned Parenthood. (documentation at this [link](#))
- America Ferrera – actress who uses her celebrity voice to advocate for Planned Parenthood. (documentation at this [link](#))
- Madeleine Albright – former Secretary of State. Long time supporter of abortion rights and Planned Parenthood. (documentation at this [link](#))

GSUSA and local Girl Scout councils promote organizations that advocate for abortion rights and/or organizations that fund abortion providers:

- Every Girl Scout council, through the official Girl Scout curriculum for girls, recommends and features organizations that publicly advocate for abortion rights and/or support the abortion industry such as:
- Amnesty International – advocates for sexual and reproductive rights. Seeks to decriminalize abortion in all countries that outlaw it. (documentation at this [link](#))
- National Organization for Women (NOW) – pro-abortion organization advocating for "reproductive justice." (documentation at this [link](#))
- Population Council – works to increase access to safe abortion, family planning services and to develop new contraceptive technologies. (documentation at this [link](#))
- ACLU – currently advocating for “reproductive freedom”, same sex marriage and the HHS mandate. (documentation at this [link](#))
- Sierra Club – labels itself a “pro-choice” organization. Includes Planned Parenthood and many abortion advocates in their Global Population and Environment Program initiative. (documentation at this [link](#))
- WAGGGS – openly advocates for abortion on demand and contraception for youth. (documentation at this [link](#))
- Oxfam – promotes access to family planning services including contraception and proper abortion facilities. (documentation at this [link](#))

GSUSA and local Girl Scout councils recommend concerning content to girls.

- Every Girl Scout council, through the official Girl Scout curriculum for girls, features concerning recommendations such as:
- Glee (recommended tv show) – glamorizes teen sex. (documentation at this [link](#))
- Clueless (recommended movie) – ridicules virginity, includes teen sexual activity and adolescent drug use. (documentation at this [link](#))
- Circle of Friends (recommended movie) – includes many subplots dealing with women’s sexuality including premarital sex, abortion and attempted rape. (documentation at this [link](#))
- How to Make an American Quilt (featured movie) – includes adultery, sexual promiscuity, drug use and nudity. (documentation at this [link](#))
- Moral relativism – Girl Scouts lays out four tests to determine right from wrong which completely omits any mention of religious standards or objective morality. Proposes utilitarian ethics and equality as guideposts for "figuring out your ethical standards." (documentation at this [link](#))
- Games For Change (featured organization) – promotes video games targeted at pre-teens and teens depicting controversial issues such as sexuality, sexual activity and "safe sex with friends." (documentation at this [link](#))
- DoSomething.org (recommended website) – featured campaigns include "Get Some (Consent)" which instructs participants to "share hot tips for consensual sex." (documentation at this [link](#))
- Idealist.org (recommended website) – connects girls with porn websites (including teen porn); jobs, events and volunteer opportunities at Planned Parenthood; and support/advocacy for sex workers. (documentation at this [link](#))
